Pastor's Ponderings

Wow, December is here. Based on the television commercials, one would think Christmas is tomorrow. I find it irritating that merchants insist on rushing Christmas. Part of my angst is the length of time I have to listen to the really bad singing of Michael Bolton. Even if I was in the market for a new Honda, I wouldn't buy one because the commercials are horrible. Another part of my irritation is that Advent is completely lost to most. We run straight to the manger and forget the journey leading there. Consequently, the magnificence of that night in Bethlehem is diminished. Whatever am I talking about? Perhaps the best illustration is the Gospel reading for the first Sunday in Advent. Jesus' words are simply terrifying. The Son of Man will come when no one is expecting him and there will be hell to pay, literally. The time is unknown, the coming sure, and there is no way to avoid it. The only hope is to be among the "elect" who are gathered by God from the four winds. Questions abound, most importantly, how do I get to be among the elect? No answer is given and so we are forced to wait, to look, to hope for a savior from God's terrible wrath. In the Gospel readings assigned for the next three Sundays, John the Baptist and Mary help by pointing to the coming savior. They proclaim a promise that all is not lost and forgiveness is coming but still we wait. So you see, Advent is a period of hopeful waiting characterized by fear of judgment. Thus, it is as a time of law putting us in our place with a "not so fast" word to our attempts to forget the reason Jesus was born in the first place. God's word to us in Advent is you are lost, you are a sinner, you are under the judgment and wrath of God, and you are dead but I'm going to fix it and he does. The savior, the forgiveness of sin, is born in a stable. Finally, Jesus, the only hope of glory is here! If you have listened aright, you still should have the nagging question, how do I get to be among the elect that Jesus was talking about in that first reading? The answer is a preacher is sent among you to do God's electing in the present by giving you this Jesus and the forgiveness of sin he brings. The preacher's tools are words combined with water, wine and bread. Through these means you are saved from sin, the devil and death. So, finally, Advent gives way to Christmas, law gives way to gospel because, you see, it was FOR YOU that God inhabited a stable.

LIVE NATIVITY

Celebrating its twenty-second year in 2013 as a community tradition, Nativity Lutheran Church's Live Nativity Scene will be staged on Saturday, December 7th, from 6 to 9 p.m. and on Sunday, December 8th, from 6 to 8:30p.m. The scene contains all the traditional figures: Mary, Joseph, the baby Jesus, shepherds, and the wise men. Live stable animals include a cow, donkey, sheep, goats and even one of the wise men's camels. Each year the scene is accompanied by narration describing the events that took place over 2000 years ago.

Preparations for the scene begin in the summer when the ladies of the church check, repair and renew the costumes. Then the weekend before Thanksgiving the church men set up the stable and hang the lights for the star. The youth help the morning of the scene filling the luminaries with sand, setting them out and lighting them as evening approaches. Finally the animals arrive and the scene is set for the annual event. In the glow of 300 luminaries the scene is located in front of the church at the corner of Crossgates Blvd. and Old Brandon Road.

Visitors are invited to drive by or park and walk up and begin the month by remembering the true meaning of the season. Refreshments will be served in the fellowship hall.

Sign-up sheets for the Live Nativity are on the table in the narthex. Volunteers are needed for cast members, costumes, set up, tear down, and to prepare and serve refreshments.

Evangelism Report for November

New poster with added pictures of Nativity membership has been completed and is displayed in the Narthex. Thanks to all members who were willing to share their smiling faces with us!

The council held a vote regarding getting a new front church sign over two consecutive Sunday's in November. Almost three quarters of the congregation (72.4% vs 27.6%) pretty decisively said we need a new sign. Many members prefer that the council not start on the project until funds are in hand, so the next (and imminent) step will be to launch a series of fund raising events. These will be announced shortly. We currently have about \$2300 on hand and will need about \$3000 additional. Target date for completed installation will be in the Spring.

Several members expressed a preference for other projects instead of a new sign. The parking lot was frequently mentioned as an example. While there will always be valid alternative demands for our limited resources, the council (and apparently the wide majority of the congregation) believes that an important aspect of our mission is to reach out to potential new members. The proposed new sign will be an important step in that direction. It is also, based on evaluating many possible alternatives to promoting our church (newspaper advertising, mailers, bill-boards, grocery cart ads, retail posters, etc.) the most cost-effective method of reaching many people in the Brandon/Pearl community of potential Nativity Lutherans. Regarding the parking lot repairs, we surveyed that project three years ago. The cost to properly resurface the lot would cost approximately \$27,000 (based on three contractor bids). It would also require the removal of several of the large trees surrounding the parking lot.

We believe that the sign at about \$5000 will serve the Church by bringing Nativity more new members than the \$27,000 parking lot fix. *The Evangelism Committee*
